### Teaneck Environmental Commission Annual Report 2014 and 2015 Completed June 6 2016

#### INTRODUCTION

This report for 2015 was prepared in accordance with Township Ordinance Section 2-125 and NJSA 40:56 A-4 which require the Environmental Commission (EC) to make not less than annual reports to the Township Council in writing. This report includes data collected in 2014 on site plan reviews, but the report was never completed. In this report information is provided on the site plan reviews for both 2014 and 2015, (but only the data for 2015 have been summarized), conducted by the Commission as provided by the Municipal Land Use Law (MLUL) for Environmental Commissions which have an Environmental Resource Inventory (ERI), as does Teaneck. Data are shown on tables appended to this report and discussed below. Additional information contained in this report includes training, grants, projects worked on during the year, Commission budget and expenditures, goals for 2016, recognitions and acknowledgements.

The Commission provides advice to the Council via the Manager on environmental issues. It may conduct special Township-wide meetings to inform the public on specific environmental issues and get public input. Below is a summary of the many activities performed by and monitored by the Commission during 2015.

SITE PLAN REVIEW (Allowed as provided for by MLUL, if Environmental Commission has an Environmental Resource Inventory, which Teaneck has).

33 Plans refused by the zoning officer were received for preview, but only six needed full Commission review. However, none of the six that needed review were received by the Commission. See Table 1 in the Appendix. Three plans were previewed from the Planning Board. One was requested for full review but never received. The Commission also reviewed one DEP application for Englewood Pond dredging, one for permits for River Commons in Teaneck, and one for Anderson Street bridge supports.

### **GRANTS**

There were no new grant proposals made in 2015, nor any follow-ups.

The commission assisted the Hackensack River Greenway Advisory Board and Friends of the Greenway with a grant proposal.

2. Assist Hackensack River Greenway Advisory Board
□ Hackensack River Greenway AB report Our main project this year was developing plans for ADA trail at 640 River Road. With Friends and the help of the NJ Land Conservancy, we were able to get grants to the township of \$30,000 from Bergen County Open Space Trust Fund, and \$60,000 from NJ DEP Greenacres for the project. In the fall we hired Princeton Hydro to spray the invasives, mostly Japanese Knotwood. They sprayed twice and will come again in early spring to check on the results. We had Tahawas Trails design the trail and they have submitted a proposal for construction in the early spring. Rohlers has designed a sitting area based on the plans from Mary Topolosky. We are waiting for construction proposals for this. Bergen Fencing installed a fence along the stream bed where there is a significant drop. Teaneck Garden Club supplied 12 native plants which was transplanted at the lower level. In the spring, native grasses and plants will be added along the fence and trail. The town council this fall approved of naming the site the Mary Topolsky Garden and Trail. DPW will provide the signage. Five Star Residence has agreed to provide continued maintenance to sitting area butterfly/bird garden. Hopefully, the project will be completed in late spring of 2016.
□Rich Karp and Marie Warnke attended a conference on invasive plants at the NYBG.
□We met with Dick Frick and William Broughton to discuss maintenance along the trail at FDU and got agreement to open up visitas across from the benches.
□We supported the purchase of 671 Pomander Walk and spoke at a hearing of the BC Open Space Fund to obtain funding.
□ After the 640 project is completed, our next goal is improving the trail at Riverside Drive.
